On **Wednesday January 22nd** at 7.00pm in Kendal Meeting House, there will be a talk by Hilary Davis on the Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme. Hilary returned from the West Bank in July, having spent three months in Jericho as an EAPPI. She will be talking about the impact on daily life of checkpoints on the communities within the Jordan Valley. Hilary writes ‘Just a bit of background - There are two checkpoints which split the Jordan Valley from the rest of the West Bank. Since the 7th October they have been permanently staffed and have created many problems for the local population in all aspects of life. I am going to share three examples looking at the Economic, Medical & Educational impact.’ Please let John Hall know if you will be attending.
