Mon 1st	“Keep my heart seeking Lord so I can walk the heaven on earth; for you are walking with me.” Hilary Faith Jones
Tues 2nd	Give thanks for all the community groups in and around Kendal which offer friendship, support, activity and entertainment for many people; especially remembering those who would otherwise be lonely.
Wed 3rd	Every good gift and every perfect present comes down from heaven; it comes down from God. James 1 :17
Thurs 4th	Sovereign Lord, we pray that your hand continues to guide the KCT1000 project, leading the way in all decisions and strengthening the team bearing most of the load.
Fri 5th	WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY Loving God, help us to care for your creation, to preserve its fragile equilibrium and to work for the well being of all people and all things.
Sat 6th	For the world leaders, we pray for wisdom and hearts of compassion. We pray for the peaceful end to the conflicts around the world.
Sun 7th	WORLD OCEANS DAY (8th) We pray for the healing of our oceans, and for the protection of marine life. Give us wisdom to change our habits, so one generation may proclaim to another the wonder of your works.

Mon 8th	The pathway: those that never hear or dismiss the Word as irrelevant or rubbish
Tues 9th	Stony ground: those who hear gladly for a moment, but that soon fades
Wed 10th	Among thorns: those who hear and would follow, but struggle among the pressures and alternatives of daily life

Thurs 11th	BARNABAS - Apostle Following the example of St Barnabas pray to be generous in our judgements and unselfish in our service, encouraging others
Fri 12th	The good soil: those who hear, are nurtured and follow, however imperfectly
Sat 13th	All whose words may be a conduit for the seed, especially our clergy
Sun 14th	For us as a missional community to show the love of God and speak patiently, wisely and unashamedly
<i>A week of thankful reflection (and ask, if you wish)</i>	
Mon 15th	In your mind's eye go round our church building and give thanks for ways it draws us into worship and points to God made known in Christ
Tues 16th	Look around at the things and pictures in any room where you live, in gratitude for the people and events they connect to
Wed 17th	Pause in a garden, park or green space and offer praise for the beauty and vitality seen
Thurs 18th	Reflect on the people who keep us safe and care for us, and those who keep Kendal going
Fri 19th	Open your purse or wallet: what aspects of daily life are underpinned by things in there?
Sat 20th	WORLD REFUGEE DAY Give thanks for the strength given to people forced to flee their homes due to conflict, persecution, or violence.
Sun 21st	Give thanks for the varied membership of our church, even those who aren't quite perfect!
Mon 22nd	Reflect on some times in your life when you have received mercy and grace.
Tues 23rd	Give thanks for the Grace we have received and the privilege to be called His daughters and sons

Wed 24th	<p>THE BIRTH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST</p> <p>There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light. John 1: 6, 7a</p>
Thurs 25th	<p>“Help me to journey beyond the familiar and into the unknown. Give me faith to leave the old ways and to break fresh ground with you.” St Brendan</p>
Fri 26th	<p>For news programmes, newspapers and journalists everywhere, we pray for honesty and integrity as they bring us their reports of world and local events.</p>
Sat 27th	<p>“The God we are seeking is not the one who dwells far from us; we have him within us.” St Columbanus</p>
Sun 28th	<p>My heart is not proud, Lord, my eyes are not haughty; I do not concern myself with great matters or things too wonderful for me.</p> <p>But I have calmed and quieted myself, I am like a weaned child with its mother; like a weaned child I am content.</p> <p>Psalms 131 v 1-2</p>
Mon 29th	<p>PETER AND PAUL - Apostles</p> <p>Give thanks for the life, faith and leadership of the Apostles Peter and Paul.</p>
