

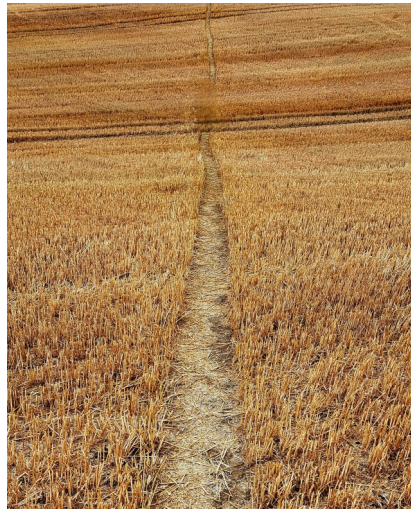

Mon 31st	AIDAN <i>Bishop of Lindisfarne and Missionary (died 651)</i> Leave me alone with God as much as may be. Sun 13th	For those being Confirmed today. That the Holy Spirit will be powerfully present and touch the hearts of family and friends that don't know Jesus
<i>This week we are focusing on the theme of Forgiveness</i>	
Mon 14th	Matthew 1 v21. Give thanks for so great a love, offering forgiveness to all across the ages.
Tues 15th	Matthew 5 v5-v11: reflect on the call to live out forgiveness with the desire and meekness of Our Lord himself, pursuing peace and reconciliation at all times
Wed 16th	Matthew 5 v21-v30: reading again the impossible standard we are called to, let God's grace in on any anger, grievances and wayward thoughts you might be holding and pray for others, too.
Thurs 17th	Matthew 5 v43-v48: pray for all Christians, especially those under persecution, to love way beyond boundaries.
Fri 18th	Matthew 9 v10-v13: Consider again the radical forgiveness offered by Jesus to outcasts and pray that the Church (including KPC!) in our age might be a channel for such giving.
Sat 19th	"Be kind to one another, tender hearted, forgiving one another as God in Christ forgave you" . Ephesians 4 v32 Pray it might become so for all of us and nothing less.
Sun 20th	HARVEST If you want to know the creator, understand created things. <i>St Columbanus</i>

Mon 21st	ST MATTHEW THE APOSTLE Jesus said "Follow me" Matthew got up and followed him. Matthew 9:9 Give me grace to be like Matthew, to renounce selfish pursuits and follow Christ. For those who are called, but who struggle to trust You.
